GOLF RULES

1 TECHNICAL REGULATIONS

- 1.1 The AUG golf competition will be organised in accordance with:
- 1.1.1 The AUG General Rules & Regulations.
 - 1.1.2 The current technical regulations of the International Golf Federation.

- 1.2 The competition will consist of the following events:

Men	Women
Individual	Individual
Team	Team

- 1.3 Each country is authorised to enter:
- 1.3.1 A maximum of 6 men competitors, 6 women competitors and 5 team officials. Number of team officials shall not exceed number of competitors.
 - 1.3.2 Individual Events: Maximum of 2 competitors per event.
 - 1.3.3 Team Events: Maximum of 1 team. Each team shall consist of a maximum of 4 competitors.
 - 1.3.4 Each competitor may take part in a maximum of 2 events.
- 1.4 Countries must confirm and submit their list of competitors at the General Technical Briefing.

2 COMPETITION REGULATIONS

- 2.1 Competition Venue
- 2.1.1 The competition will be held at the Royal Myanmar Golf Club, Nay Pyi Taw, Myanmar.
- 2.2 Format of Play
- 2.2.1 All events are over 72-holes scratch stroke play.
 - 2.2.2 For the team event, the competitors will play 18 holes daily. The total of the best 3 scores daily will count as the daily team score.
 - 2.2.3 The winner of the team event shall be the team returning the lowest aggregate score 72-holes.
 - 2.2.4 In the event of a tie in the team event, the scores of the 4th scores will be used to determine the winning team. This count back method will commence from the 4th round

scores. If the winner is still not determined, the 3rd round will be used followed by the 2nd and finally the 1st round.

2.2.5 In the event of a tie in the individual event for the 1st placing, the tie shall be decided by a hole-by-hole play-off. The play-off holes shall be Hole 18.

2.2.6 In the event of a tie in the individual event for the 2nd, 3rd and the rest of the positions, the tie shall be decided by count back system matching final round scores (18 holes). If the tie still persists, 9 holes scores (10 to 18) will be used followed by last 6 holes scores (13 to 18), then 3 holes scores (16 to 18), then 1 hole scores (18).

2.3 Unplayable

2.3.1 If the course is declared unplayable, or inclement weather prohibits fair play, and as a result it is not possible to complete 72 holes of play, the organisers will decide on the number of rounds to be played.

2.3.2 If it is not possible to at least have 36 holes, the competition will be terminated without any winners.

2.4 Starting Time and Groups

2.4.1 Starting times and groups for the first 2 rounds will be arranged by the organisers. Starting time and groups for the last 2 rounds shall be arranged in accordance with the team scores; the best scores teeing off last. Competitors will be paired according to scores; the best scores teeing off last. However, if a competitor is an individual medal contender but his/her team is not amongst the top three teams after 36 holes, the organisers may exercise the option to pair him/her with the top individual medal contenders.

2.4.2 Competitors shall start at the time laid down by the organisers

2.4.3 If a competitor arrives at his/her starting point, ready to play, within five minutes after the starting time, in the absence of valid circumstances which warrant waiving the penalty of disqualification, the penalty for failure to start on time is two strikes, instead of disqualification.

2.5 Slow Play

2.5.1 Penalties will be imposed on competitors for undue delay.

2.5.2 Pace of play conditions will be issued to competitors before the start of play.

2.6 Practice Between Holes

2.6.1 A competitor shall not play any practice stroke on or near the putting green of the last hole played. If a practice stroke is played on or near the putting green of the hole last played, the player will incur a penalty of two strokes at the

next hole, except in the case of the last hole of the round, in which case, he/she incurs the penalty at that hole.

2.7 Transportation

2.7.1 Competitors shall walk at all times during a stipulation round unless authorised by the organisers. Penalty for breach of this condition is two strokes at each hole at which the breach occurred with a maximum penalty of 4 strokes per round.

2.8 Caddies

2.8.1 Anyone may caddie for competitors during the practice rounds. However, during the competition rounds, all competitors must use caddies provided by the organisers. Caddies will be assigned on a random basis.

2.9 Score Cards

2.9.1 A competitor is considered to have returned his/her score card when he/she has left the scoring area.
